


By December 2020, Adobe will have retired the Flash web application. As many MLS users are aware, this carries implications for the Realist public record search product provided by MLSOK. Until that time, users may see increased measures taken by web browsers to prevent the use of Flash-enabled sites. Such action is taken with the intent that web developers will move away from Flash-enabled products by the 2020 deadline.

As of August 2019, CoreLogic has projected that Realist will be re-launched in its new format sometime in early to mid-2020.


Below are instructions for re-configuring the Google Chrome browser to run Flash-enabled sites (Realist).

In Google Chrome, locate and left-click the menu button (vertical ellipses).


Click 'Settings'



On the 'Settings' page, scroll down and left click, once 'Advanced' appears towards the center of the page.




From the available options, click 'Site Settings'



Find 'Flash'. Left-click if text reads "Block sites from using Flash". Leave alone if "Ask First"



Left-Click the “switch” to change to ‘Ask First’ (should turn blue).




Return to ‘Site Settings’.


Find ‘Pop-ups and redirects’. Left-Click if text below reads “Blocked”. Should read “Allowed”.



Left-Click the “switch” to change to ‘Allowed’.



Close **all** Chrome windows. Restarting Chrome (and the machine if on a Mac) will apply the changes. User will still be prompted to download Realist, however Chrome will now ask the user to allow Flash to run in the top left-hand corner of the window, once the user left-clicks “here” to be taken to the Adobe page.



Similar settings can be found in other browsers. Mozilla Firefox, Microsoft Internet Explorer, Microsoft Edge, and Safari (Mac). In a Google Search, type “Access site settings for...” then the name of the browser you are using. The same task can be performed for Pop-up settings as well.
